Mike Riccardi – President

Mike grew up in West Long Branch, New Jersey. He graduated from Rutgers University in 1987 with a BS in Accounting. Mike is the Chief Executive Officer of Tudor Investment Corporation, a leading alternative asset management firm founded by Paul Tudor Jones in 1980, based in Stamford, CT. Tudor is active in the global fixed income, currency, equity and commodity markets for an international clientele. Mike was appointed CEO in November 2017 and previously served as the firm's Co-President (January 2013 - December 2016), President (December 2016 – November 2017) and Chief Operating Officer (January 2010 – January 2017). Mike is a member of Tudor's Board of Directors, Chairman of the Tudor Management Committee and serves on various other Tudor committees, including the Capital Allocation Committee. Prior to joining Tudor in 1991, he was an Audit Manager at the National Futures Association (1987 - 1991). Christina Johnson - Wolff – Vice President

Most recently Christina was the co-founder and owner of Walin and Wolff, a group of women's specialty stores in Westchester and Fairfield counties, along with an online business and distribution site. This business operated on affluent main street locations from 2012 until 2018.

Prior to this, Christina was a partner in the Private Equity firm NRDC. During her tenure, the firm acquired Lord and Taylor, Hudson Bay Canada, and Linens and Things. In this role, she was the managing retailer partner working with investors and new acquisitions. She also opened her own consulting company, Christina Johnson and Associates. She had joined Saks Fifth Avenue as SVP Director of stores, followed by EVP Director of stores and finally Vice Chairman – COO. She had responsibilities spanning store operations, finance, merchandise planning, and strategic planning across these roles. Prior to this, Mrs. Johnson-Wolff held several senior merchandising and operational positions at Marshall Field's & Company. In addition to her retail career, she has served on several boards, both profit and non-profit. These include AXA Financial, Lord & Taylor, Loyola University of Chicago, Women in Need, NIAF, Grant a Wish, and the Connecticut Food Bank.
